1) For Option 1 on Pacific from McPhillips to Weston, three treatments are possible: south-side cycle track with a cyclist-priority signal at McPhillips; south-side multi-use pathway with a cyclist-priority signal at McPhillips; or two bike lanes. Which do you prefer and why?

2) On Elgin, between Keewatin and King Edward, two options are presently suggested to create the bike boulevard: changing the stop sign direction at Juba and Oddy to give priority to Elgin or mini-roundabouts. Which do you prefer, where and why?

3) On Elgin, at Keewatin, the intersection could be left as is (crossing Keewatin via the existing pedestrian corridor), or a median added that both forces a right turn and provides a refuge and curb cuts for crossing? Which do you prefer and why? _____

4) On Alexander, between Winks and Elgin, there are eight possible locations to install mini-roundabouts and/or stop sign priority to the bike boulevard. Which do you prefer, where and why?

5) For Option 2, on King Edward from Skinner to Bannatyne, two treatments are possible: sharing the roadway with vehicles for this one block or sharing the sidewalk with pedestrians. Which do you prefer and why?
